CCMS is a doctoral-level department within the Cathy Hughes School of Communications. The other units include the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders; the Department of Strategic, Legal and Management Communication; and the Department of Media, Journalism and Film. CCMS has 5 full-time faculty, an additional 17 affiliate faculty, and 38 doctoral students. The department offers three specialty tracks: Media and Cultural Studies; Technology, Policy, and Society; and Health Communication. The department emphasizes the Howard mission of social responsibility in its commitment to advance the education of and knowledge about African American and other under-served communities.

Qualifications

The Candidate's primary responsibilities include taking an active role in research, teaching, and service. The successful candidate will teach doctoral courses in research methodologies, communication theory, and in their area of expertise. Applicants must hold an earned doctorate in communications, possess a record of published scholarship, and have experience teaching graduate students. Applicants should also be able to demonstrate the potential for producing and maintaining an ongoing program of research. Preference will be given to candidates who have proven teaching proficiency. The candidate should demonstrate a record of success contributing to excellence in teaching, mentoring and research within diverse campus environments and a firm commitment to assisting the department's efforts to support the university's mission (https://howard.edu/about/mission). The ideal candidate will be able to teach in two of the Department's foci; with a primary specialization in Technology, Policy and Society and a secondary expertise in either Media and Cultural Studies or Health Communication.
