2 Constitution of the cons

Attention All COMM Studies...

All COMM Juniors and Seniors must enroll in the Summer Practicum-Internship course for credit for a Summer Internship!!!

Now that I have you attention, Hi COMM Juniors and Seniors!

FIRST, as you should know, before you graduate, all COMM majors are required to be enrolled in the Practicum-Internship course during the SAME SEMESTER as they work in an internship position that is relevant to their major concentration.

You should register for the course according to your concentration. All courses/sections meet together at the same day/time with me as the instructor, but you register by concentration for the course. NOTE: This summer, the course will be meet virtually via Zoom on Thursdays 12-1pm.

SECOND, although there is guidance available, the course does not provide you with an internship. You are responsible for securing the internship yourself (see HU Center for Career and Professional Success for assistance; as well as occasional emails about internship opportunities from the COMM department chairs and faculty; I also have a contact list that I can provide you, but...). You sign up for the course at your own risk if you do not already know you will have an internship this Summer. **You CANNOT pass the course without completing 120 hours of a qualifying internship by the end of the Summer (the final grade is not awarded until the internship is completed and all course materials are submitted).**

THIRD, here are the requirements for an internship to count for the course...

Internship Requirements:

- Internship must be for an organization not owned or operated by Howard University. Additionally, no Internship will be approved for this course if the internship worksite is on campus. The only exceptions to this rule are for the following campus departments/organizations WHUT, WHUR, OUC, or Athletics. Any additional exceptions may be considered for approval on a case-by-case basis.
- The organization MUST be least 5 years old. Exceptions will be considered for approval on a case-by-case basis.
- Virtual internships are allowed (teleworking for the majority of hours is considered virtual).
- Students MUST be doing work that directly relates to their major concentration (PR, ADV, Legal, Media Mgmt, or Org Comm). Whether an
 internship meets this requirement is subject to instructor verification and approval.
- A designated supervisor who has the appropriate education/training and work experience in your major field and agrees to monitor hours, provide regular constructive feedback, and complete a course form evaluating your performance at the end of the semester.
- A physical or virtual location for which you will be working at least 120 hours.
- · All interns MUST have worked a minimum of 120 hours by their required completion date at the end of the semester.

FINALLY, note the prerequisites (by concentration) for the course...

COMM 401 Practicum-Internship: Pub Rels – Prereq: SLMC 311-Basic PR Writing (or the COMM equivalent); Junior/Senior standing **COMM 402 Practicum-Internship: Advert**. – Prereq: SLMC 3210-Advertising Sales or COMM equivalent (see instructor for approval as a corequisite); Junior/Senior standing

COMM 403 Practicum-Internship: Legal Com – Junior/Senior standing COMM 404 Practicum-Internship: Media Mgm – Junior/Senior standing

COMM 405 Practicum-Internship: Org. Comm – Prereq: SLMC 352 Intro to Org Comm or COMM equivalent (see instructor for approval as a corequisite); Junior/Senior standing



HOW TO COMPLETE GRADUATION APPLICATION IN BISON HUB

After confirming with their advisor that all degree requirements have been met, students should complete the graduation application, referred to as <u>Apply for Program Completion</u> in Bison Hub.

FROM THE SEARCH AT THE TOP OF THE HOME PAGE:

- 1. Enter and select "Apply for Program Completion". The Apply for Program Completion form displays.
- 2. The Academic Record and Name details will auto-populate. Verify the name listed is your name. The university will reach out at the end of term to confirm legal name and address.
- 3. Select the checkbox next to RSVP for Commencement to be included in the program for the upcoming Commencement ceremony.
- 4. Select the checkbox next to the Program of Study to indicate program completion.
- 5. Students applying for Spring 2025 graduation must edit the Expected Completion Date to 5/10/25.
- 6. Select the checkbox next to Confirm.
- 7. Click Submit, then click Done.


The application for program completion has been submitted. The submitted application can be viewed in Archive within a student's My Tasks.

Once the application is submitted, no further action is required by the student. You will see a \$100 charge to your account for Graduation Fee. Additional information regarding program completion and graduation activities will be sent from the university.










The 52nd annual Student Academy Awards competition is accepting submissions. The deadline for submitting a film for consideration is Sunday, May 18, 2025 at 11:59pm PT. Please note the earlier-than-usual deadline date.

This year, some changes have been made to our rules to expand eligibility:

- We have removed the accreditation requirement for schools, allowing more schools to qualify that previously did not qualify.
- We will now allow students in certificatebased programs to submit their final film projects.
- We will no longer offer waivers or film festival qualifying as alternate ways to qualify a film if it is not an intermediatelevel or graduation film.

What films are now eligible for the competition?

- Undergraduate intermediate-level films (third-year projects)
- Undergraduate capstone films
- Graduate school intermediate-level films (second-year projects)
- · Graduate school thesis films
- Associate degree final film projects
- Certificate program final film projects

Students can still submit these films directly to the competition via FilmFreeway.



We are also excited to highlight that this year's Student Academy Awards ceremony will be held in New York City for the first time. It will take place at the Ziegfeld Ballroom on October 6, 2025.


