

- Please check your transcript for any incomplete grades, meaning any grade that says IB, IC, ID or IF. You will not be able to receive your diploma if you have incomplete grades.
- Please make sure you are financially cleared by April 24, 2026.

## HOW TO COMPLETE GRADUATION APPLICATION IN BISON HUB

After confirming with their advisor that all degree requirements have been met, students should complete the graduation application, referred to as Apply for Program Completion in Bison Hub.

### FROM THE SEARCH AT THE TOP OF THE HOME PAGE:

1. Enter and select "Apply for Program Completion". The Apply for Program Completion form displays.

2. The Academic Record and Name details will auto-populate. Verify the name listed is your name. The university will reach out at the end of term to confirm legal name and address.

3. Select the checkbox next to RSVP for Commencement to be included in the program for the upcoming Commencement ceremony.

4. Select the checkbox next to the Program of Study to indicate program completion.

5. Students applying for Spring 2026 graduation must edit the Expected Completion Date to 5/15/26.

6. Select the checkbox next to Confirm.

7. Click Submit, then click Done.

*The application for program completion has been submitted. The submitted application can be viewed in Archive within a student's My Tasks.*

*Once the application is submitted, no further action is required by the student. You will see a \$100 charge to your account for Graduation Fee. Additional information regarding program completion and graduation activities will be sent from the university.*

The Coca-Cola HBCU Sports Broadcasting Grant is a **\$40,000 grant program** celebrating outstanding **student storytellers** at **Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs)** who are passionate about **sports, storytelling and media production**.

This initiative is administered by the **Foundation of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS)** – the organization behind the **Emmy® Awards** – and honors the next generation of sports media creators who bring to life the voices, pride and impact of HBCU athletics.

**Total Grant Pool:** \$40,000 to be awarded to one, two or three winning entries depending on the scores.

*Exact award tiers will be announced prior to disbursement.*

## COMPETITION OVERVIEW

### Eligibility

To qualify:

- You must be an **undergraduate student enrolled at an HBCU**.
- You may **enter individually** or **as part of a student team**.
- Multiple submissions from the same school are welcome.
- You do **not** need to be a journalism or media major – this competition is open to all storytellers who want to explore the power of sports.

*Entries that do not meet these eligibility requirements will not be considered.*



# The Dan Jenkins Medal for Excellence in Sportswriting *2026 Student Submission Form*

[The Dan Jenkins Medal for Excellence in Sportswriting](#) is presented annually in honor of the legendary Texas sportswriter and best-selling author, who defined the sportswriter's craft for a generation. The [Center for Sports Communication & Media](#) at UT-Austin sponsors the awards, which come with a cash prize. The Jenkins Medal is awarded in four categories:

- The Dan Jenkins Medal for Lifetime Achievement in Sportswriting
- The Dan Jenkins Medal for Best Sportswriting (in the previous calendar year)
- The Dan Jenkins Medal for Best Book
- The Dan Jenkins Medal for Student Sportswriting (in the previous calendar year)

Previous winners of the Jenkins Medals in the Lifetime Achievement category are Frank Deford, Dave Kindred, Gary Smith, Rick Telander, Roger Angell, Sally Jenkins, Bill Rhoden, Grant Wahl and Roy Blount, Jr. Previous winners of the Jenkins Medal in Best Sportswriting category are Wright Thompson (twice), Chris Ballard, Sarah Spain, Dave Sheinin, Elizabeth Merrill, Mitchell S. Jackson, Jeff Passan, Tom Junod and Paula Lavigne, and Sally Jenkins. The Best Book and Student Sportswriting awards are new for 2026.

The Center for Sports Communication & Media will host the Jenkins Medal awards dinner in Austin this fall, celebrating the award winners and the 2026 Jenkins Medal Sports Legend. The Jenkins Medal jury will release a short list of finalists in the spring.

## About Dan Jenkins

A native of Fort Worth and graduate of Texas Christian University, Jenkins covered sports for the Fort Worth Press and Dallas Times Herald before moving to New York City in the early 1960s where he would write more than 500 articles for Sports Illustrated, cementing himself as the nation's authority on golf, college and professional football. Called "the most influential sportswriter of his generation," and possessor of an incomparable literary voice, he was the author of countless prize-winning stories still collected in anthologies, 23 bestselling books, and several screenplays. He died on March 7, 2019 at age 90.

Jenkins' novels include "Semi Tough," "Dead Solid Perfect" and "Baja Oklahoma," each of which was made into a feature film. In 2005, he served as official historian of the National Football Foundation and in 2012, Jenkins was one of only three writers to be inducted in the World Golf Hall of Fame. In addition to numerous awards and lifetime achievement honors, Jenkins career spans more than six decades and includes induction in the National Sportswriters and Sportscasters Hall of Fame, Texas Sports Hall of Fame, Texas Golf Hall of Fame, and the TCU Lettermen's Hall of Fame.




